HOW DO I FIND COURSES BEING OFFERED IN A TERM? HOW DO I REGISTER?

You can find courses that are available for the next term and other relevant information for registration by using the following steps:

- (1) On NU home page, use the **Quick Links** drop-down menu to go to the Registrar's Office web page
- (2) In the Announcements section of the Registrar's page, click on '[Online class listings](#).'
- (3) Click on the [Term](#) you want in the **Undergraduate Full-Time Day Programs** for class schedules.
- (4) There are three important links in the **Semester Class Schedule** section:

[Registration Information](#) - this guides you through the procedures you will use for registering yourself.

[Main Listings](#) - this sends you to a listing of Colleges and Departments (alphabetically listed) where you can look at course offerings by all of the Departments.

- Freshmen:
[Find-A-Class in the NU Core](#) - this lists by core categories the various courses that can be used to fulfill the NU Core requirements.
- Other Class Years (sophomore & above):
[Find-A-Class in the College of Arts and Sciences Core](#) - this lists by core categories the courses that can be used to fulfill the College Core requirements.

Important Note: when you access any of these course listings, information is provided on the sequence hour and whether there are any openings in that course, as well as the number of seats still available (this availability number is updated overnight after each day's registration). Be sure to use the link under the course - [More info \(main listing\)](#) - to find out the key number for the course and a link to the course description which also tells you if there are any prerequisites for that course.

Before you go online to register, or call the registration telephone number, prepare a list of the 4 courses that you would like to register for and their **key numbers**. In addition to this preferred list, have a **backup list of courses** that will be your options in case a course on your primary list is not available. As always, double check your lists to make sure that there are no time conflicts among the courses you will be trying to register for. Only you can actually sign-up for courses the week that registration begins for the next semester. However, you can contact the Dean's Office advisor (Kim Irmiter) at any time if you are experiencing trouble with registration, or meet with or contact your Psychology Department advisor (call the main psychology office, 617-373-3076) if you need help or advice in selecting courses.
