**Lectures:**

- \*Exams will consist of Multiple Choice, Matching (and perhaps True/False) questions. Quizzes will include the above as well as short-answer and fill-in-the-blank questions.

**Make-up policy:**

- \*Make-ups will not be given for quizzes (**no exceptions**). You may take a quiz with a different section, with permission from the instructor or T.A. (If you have serious health problems or other unusual circumstances, please let the instructor know ASAP).
- \*Make-up exams will be given when necessary. You must provide a written medical excuse or note from the Dean (if requested). Please discuss any unusual circumstances with the instructor. If you take a make-up exam it may be a different exam than the one given at the regular time. Please arrange to make up the exam as soon as possible.
